It's hard to believe that summer has passed so quickly and fall is already in the air. Along with the falling leaves comes the colder weather and we all know what that means for Northwest Ohio...snow! Please keep in mind the following information for the season changes:

◇ Leaves

Please do not rake leaves in to the street. Leaves are not allowed at the Village Vegetation Site. Leaf Collection is available at Daryl Blausey's located at 685 Port Clinton Road.

◇ Snow

Sidewalks: By Ordinance (Codified section 521.14), the

owner or occupant of any premises within the limits of the Village shall within twenty-four hours of the end of any substantial snowfall remove all snow from the sidewalk, in front of the premises, owned or occupied by them.

Parking: Snow emergencies will be determined in conjunction with the Sandusky County Sheriff's Department and the Village Police Department. When there is substantial accumulation, we ask residents to help us by moving their vehicle(s) off the streets. This will allow us the

opportunity to remove the snow more efficiently. The following radio stations will be notified of snow emergency levels, Eagle 99, K100 and 101.5 the River as well



GAS AGGREGATION

What is gas aggregation?

The definition is....the process in which energy is sold to consumers who have joined together as a group to buy a product.

Woodville was certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio as a "governmental aggregator". By buying large blocks of energy, aggregated groups may reduce a supplier's marketing and administrative costs. This gives the aggregated group greater buying power. The reduced costs may then be passed on to the individual consumers in the buying-group as savings on their gas bills.

What does that mean for you?

Columbia gas offers its customers the chance to participate in the CHOICE Program. American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP), acting as our broker, negotiates the rate with the supplier that offers the best price. If you, as a resident of Woodville, do not choose a different supplier you will automatically be placed with the chosen supplier at the negotiated rate. There are many alternative suppliers and all offer their own rate. For a list of suppliers and rates you can visit www.puco.ohio.gov and choose the Apples to Apples link on the left, or call 1-800-299-7271.

As with all contracts, you should carefully read and understand all terms and conditions before signing any forms or agreeing to enroll with a supplier for natural gas service. When considering a supplier, the following are a few questions you may want to ask.

- Is the rate fixed or a monthly variable?
- What is the contract term?
- Is there an early termination fee?

Please keep in mind that if you choose another supplier you will also incur a Columbia Gas service and delivery charge.
